PROJECT ACCOUNTANT FOR COMPONENT 2 TO SUPPORT DPF-MPWT REFERENCE NO. CRRCIP-IC-013

The Government of Lao Peoples Democratic Republic (GoL) has received financing support from the World Bank's (WB) International Development Association (IDA) to implement the Lao PDR Climate Resilient Road Connectivity Improvement Project (CRRCIP), and intends to apply part of the proceeds for consulting services.

The proposed of Climate Resilient Road Connectivity Improvement Project (CRRCIP) seeks to build about 300 km of District Roads and Rural Roads in the poor districts of Khammouan, Savannakhet, and Saravan provinces. The MPWT in consultation with the DPWT of these three provinces had identified a long list of proposed roads. About 100 km of roads in each of the provinces will be selected from the roads in this longlist through a prioritization exercise based on aspects which include: (i) passing through a poor district – based on poverty headcount, (ii) criticality of the link for climate resiliency of the network, (iii) connectivity to agricultural areas, (iv) population served by the road, (v) traffic level, (vi) not passing through environmentally sensitive areas, and (vii) no resettlement of more than 200 people (or 40 households) and/or more than 40 households severely affected with 10 percent of productive assets owned by individual household lost in all three target provinces. The proposed project provides connectivity to National Roads and access to the east-west economic corridor between Vietnam and Thailand thus increasing market linkages and contributing towards greater economic gains to the local communities.

The CRRCIP now intends to engage a full-time, suitably qualified, and experienced Accountant for the Department of Planning and Finance, Ministry of Public Works and Transport (MPWT), to undertake tasks under Component 4, as described in the Terms of Reference (ToR). This assignment is intended as a full-time individual consultant contract for up to 24 months. The assignment is planned to commence in January 2026, with the possibility of renewal based on project needs and satisfactory performance. The duty station will be at the DPF-MPWT Office in Vientiane, Lao PDR.

The CRRCIP now invites eligible individual consultants to indicate their interest in providing the Services. Interested Consultant should provide information (CV, Expression of Interest, other supporting information, if any) demonstrating that s/he has the required qualifications and relevant experience to perform the Services. In order to qualify for this position, the candidates shall meet the following experience and competence requirements:

- At least a bachelor degree in accounting, finance, management, or business administration. A local or an internationally recognized professional qualification e.g. CPA will be an advantage.
- At least 3 years of experience in accounting and Financial Management
- Experience working with major donor funded projects, particularly with World Bank funded projects, will be an advantage
- Proven knowledge of government and foreign aid project operations and of national Treasury MOF payment procedures is required;
- A past similar assignment of same level and nature in a Government or ODA project is highly desirable;
- Good report writing and good command of both spoken and written English and Lao is required:
- Excellent interpersonal skills and result orientation combined with a flexible and adaptable attitude, of good teamwork and communication skills.

TERMS OF REFERENCE (TOR)

PROJECT ACCOUNTANT FOR COMPONENT 2 TO SUPPORT DPF-MPWT REFERENCE NO. CRRCIP-IC-13

1. Background

The Government of Lao PDR ("the GoL") provides its fund of USD 200,000 and has received financing support from the International Development Association ("the IDA") of SDR 42.3 million or equivalent to USD 56 million (in total USD 56.2 million) to implement the Lao PDR Climate Resilient Road Connectivity Improvement Project ("the CRRCIP or the Project") for the period from 24 February 2025 to 30 August 2030. The Project will carry out climate resilient road asset management works in Khammouan, Savannakhet and Salavan. The institutional strengthening elements of the project will have sector-wide coverage as they refer to sector strategy, systems improvement, and sector capacity development.

The proposed Project aims to improve climate resilient road access in targeted provinces, enhance capacity to manage road network, and in case of an Eligible Crisis or Emergency, respond promptly and effectively to it. The MPWT in consultation with the DPWTs of the three provinces has analyzed the entire 3,600 km network of the District Roads and Rural Roads in ten districts with high poverty headcounts, using a geo-spatial analysis, and shortlisted about 100 km of roads in each of the provinces through a prioritization exercise to be the proposed project roads. The prioritization was based on aspects which include: (i) passing through a poor district – based on poverty head count, (ii) criticality of the link for climate resiliency of the network, (iii) connectivity to agricultural areas, (iv) population served by the road, (v) traffic level, (vi) not passing through environmentally sensitive areas, and (vii) no resettlement of more than 200 people (or 40 households) and/or more than 40 households severely affected with 10 percent of productive assets owned by individual household lost in all three target provinces.

The Project Development Objective (PDO) is to improve climate resilient road access in targeted provinces, enhance capacity to manage the road network, and, in case of an Eligible Crisis or Emergency, respond promptly and effectively to it.

A. Scope of the Project

The Project will achieve the stated objective through activities that:

- Improve 300 km of District Roads and Rural Roads in the provinces of Khammouan, Savannakhet and Saravan to the standards of Class V/VI roads as per MPWT's Road Design Manual and addressing climate and disaster resilience aspects.
- 2. Implement management practices including financial and technical audits, environmental and social monitoring, and safety audits.
- Develop technical and operational capacity of MPWT and DPWT in OPBRC contract management and cross cutting issues on road maintenance, road safety, gender, citizen engagement and climate disaster risk.

B. Project Locations

The Project will carry out climate resilient road asset management works in Khammouan, Savannakhet and Salavan. The institutional strengthening elements of the project will have sector-wide coverage as they refer to sector strategy, systems improvement, and sector capacity development.

C. Project Components

The project has 4 components. Component 1 on Climate Resilient Road Access, Component 2 on Project Management, Component 3 on Institutional Development and Component 4 on Contingent Emergency Response.

2. Objective of the Assignment

The objective of the Project Accountant (the Accountant) is to provide technical support to the DPF in implementing financial management work for the Project including finalizing policy on provision and management of advances, reviewing and finalizing draft annual work plan and budget plan as well as supporting training activities.

The Accountant is also expected to provide technical support and ensuring that all project documents is conducted in accordance with the financial management procedures and financial plan of all financing sources under project. The Accountant will support and liaise closely with the Department of Planning and Finance and assist financial officers, staffs and/or the focal point in relevant Department within MPWT to successfully implement project activities of the project and other project as requested by MPWT.

The Accountant will work under Accounting and Finance Division of Department of Planning and finance (DPF) and work closely with other consultants and staff of DPF. The Accountant will report to Accounting and Finance Division/DPF.

The following tasks are assigned:

- 1. Responsible to record project financial transactions into the accounting software and ensure financial data is up to date;
- 2. Support the project's Financial Management in day-to-day bookkeeping and updating the financial accountants of the project;
- 3. Ensure transactions are properly approved, fully supported, correctly described, are allocated to the appropriate accounts and categories;
